TRANSFER AGREEMENT

Effective June 1, 2002

Temple University welcomes transfer applicants from both two-year and four-year colleges around the country and the world. Transfer students comprise more than half of each entering class and are a vital part of our vibrant campus communities. We know that as a prospective transfer student, you have special needs and concerns. Temple University's new and innovative DUAL ADMISSIONS and CORE-TO-CORE transfer agreements were designed to facilitate students' ease of transfer into any of Temple's 100+ undergraduate majors and, ultimately, to foster academic success.

ADVANTAGES OF THE TEMPLE-DCCC DUAL ADMISSIONS PROGRAM

If you are newly admitted to an associate's degree program or have earned 30 or fewer college-level credits, you are eligible to complete an INTENT TO ENROLL FORM available in the transfer office. **Please note:** Students who have previously been matriculated to Temple University are not eligible for the Dual Admissions program.

Registration in this program entitles you to be admitted into a bachelor's degree program at Temple provided that you: earn your associate's degree (A.A. in Behavioral Science, Communication Arts, Education, Liberal Arts) or (A.S. in Business Administration, Computer Information Systems (as of Fall 2000), Science for Health Professions, Natural Science) with a minimum **2.3** final grade point average; enroll at Temple within one year of graduation from community college; and do not attend another institution between graduation from community college and enrollment at Temple. (Your enrollment is non-binding and can be canceled if you send written notification to both Temple University and DCCC.) The program offers these distinct advantages:

* **substantial scholarship opportunities** for great students!

Full-time: \$1,000 academic scholarship to students with final 3.30-3.64 GPA;
\$2,000 academic scholarship to students with final 3.65-4.0 GPA;
award may be renewed up to three years, in addition to any federal, state or Temple need-based aid for which they qualify.

Part-time*: \$ 500 academic scholarship to transfer students with final 3.30-3.64 GPA;
\$1,000 academic scholarship to students with final 3.65-4.0 GPA; both awards may be renewed for up to three years.

* **Registered with 6-11 Temple credits per semester.**

- * **\$35 Admission fee waiver** to Temple University, less paperwork, no wait for a decision!
- * **Invitations to meet faculty** and academic advisers at preview events offered at Temple's Philadelphia and Ambler campuses.
- * **"ESL" students who earn an associate's degree** and successfully complete English Composition will not need to take the TOEFL exam.

You must complete a "DUAL ADMISSIONS INTENT" form which is available in the DCCC Transfer office, located in "A" Building, room 1325. **For additional information**, ask any DCCC transfer counselor or call Temple Admissions in Philadelphia, 215/204-6961 (Beth Tartaglia) or Ambler 215/283-1252 (Kevin Freese).

5 EASY STEPS TO DUAL ADMISSIONS:

1. **Visit the DCCC Transfer Office to fill out an “Intent to Enroll” form BEFORE completing 30 college credits. Transfer professionals will pre-screen you to make sure you are eligible for the program.**
2. **Within the semester you are accepted into the Dual Admissions Program, you will receive a CONDITIONAL ADMIT letter from Temple University.**
3. **In the semester BEFORE you are planning to begin attending Temple University, you must pick up a yellow Dual Admissions Information Form from the DCCC Transfer Office. This form should be sent to Temple along with official DCCC transcripts by JUNE 15th for Fall admission or NOVEMBER 1st for Spring Admission.**
4. **Request OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS from any other college you have attended, as well as from your high School.**
5. **To be considered for a Dual Admissions Scholarship, a FINAL TRANSCRIPT reflecting degree earned and final Grade Point Average must be sent from DCCC to the Associate Director for Transfer Students at Temple University.**

ABOUT TEMPLE’S NEW CORE-TO-CORE TRANSFER AGREEMENT

You can take advantage of Temple’s new “transfer-friendly” Core agreement that eliminates obstacles for community college graduates who want to pursue a bachelor’s degree at Temple.

The Core-to-Core Transfer agreement allows students entering Temple from DCCC with an AA (Behavioral Science, Communication Arts, Education, Liberal Arts) or AS degree (Business Administration, Computer Information Systems (as of Fall 2000), Science for Health Professions, Natural Science) received in or after 1970, to meet all university Core requirements except for two “writing-intensive” courses to be taken at Temple.

This agreement does not change the requirements of Temple’s schools and colleges, which may include courses and requirements that are also in the Core. Also, this agreement does not change the applicability of transferred courses or programs to Temple’s major requirements.

Potential transfer students from community colleges should consult their transfer counselors about these requirements. Other transfer students should consult Temple publications, or discuss the matter with an admission counselor or academic adviser.
