Delaware County Community College is a two-year institution that enrolls 28,000 students in credit and non-credit courses each year. It offers 60 associate degree programs and 39 certificate programs in a variety of academic disciplines. Transfer agreements with more than 40 four-year colleges and universities facilitate the transfer process for our students.

Locations

The College has numerous campuses and centers throughout Delaware and Chester counties. The main campus in Marple Township includes a new \$60 million STEM Complex for the study of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The Southeast Center in Sharon Hill is also located in Delaware County as is the new Upper Darby Center (opening Summer 2012).

In recent years, the College has established a major presence in Chester County with locations in Downingtown, Exton, The Chester County Hospital and in West Grove at the Chester County Intermediate Unit's Technical College High School, which is known as the Pennocks Bridge Campus.
