Anyone may establish a scholarship or award by contributing to the College's Educational Foundation. Scholarships and awards of all amounts are welcome. They may be named for the donor, such as a corporation or individual, or in memory of or in honor of a loved one.

All contributions are placed into restricted accounts and used exclusively for the scholarship or award created by the donor. Scholarships are credited to the recipients' accounts for tuition or books, and an annual event is held each year to bring students and donors together. Awards are presented at various times, as dictated by the nature of the award.
